Meet City Council

The Cleburne City Council consists of four single-member district seats and a mayor. The council supervises city operations and implements policies adopted by the council.

In the single-member district system, each area elects its own representative. The mayor, however, is elected by all residents eligible to vote.

Cleburne has a council-manager system of government. Under this system, an elected council makes policy and passes ordinances, and the city manager

Council members serve two-year terms. The council meets at 5 p.m. the second and fourth Tuesday of each month at Cleburne City Hall, 10 N. Robinson St. The city hall building anchoring the east end of downtown, formerly housed a post office. The public is encouraged to attend council meetings. When There Is Doubt, Just Throw It Out!!

Sometimes items get pushed back here or there and the truth of the matter is that they need to go away.

Spring is in the air and the winter hibernation is over. Before it gets too hot in Texas, there are always projects that need to be done. The Cleburne Transfer Station and Sanitation Department are up in full swing to assist Cleburnites with many spring duties. Here are a few ways we can help you:

Doing some spring cleaning? Or some tree trimming? Or some yard work? The Cleburne Transfer Station is open Monday through Saturday, 8 am to 4:30 pm to take trash, limbs, grass and leaves. The cost for trash and tree limbs is \$15 for a pick up load up to 800 pounds, and \$37 per ton for trailers. Grass and leaves are free.

How does the garage look? Sometimes items get pushed back here or there and the truth of the matter is that they need to go away. Remember that once a month, the Sanitation Department sends out a bulk truck and limb

truck to your neighborhood, depending on where you live. Bulk items are things that are too large for the City trash container, like a washing machine, bicycle, or a mattress. Bulk week for your area always begins on a Monday, so if you're unsure of your week, count the Mondays in the month.

- If your weekly trash pick-up is on Monday, your bulk week begins the **first** Monday of the month.
- If your weekly trash pick-up is on Tuesday, your bulk week begins the **second** Monday of the month.
- If your weekly trash pick-up is on Wednesday, your bulk week begins the **third** Monday of the month.
- If your weekly trash pick-up is on Thursday, your bulk week begins the **fourth** Monday of the month.

Are you planting a vegetable garden or a flower garden? The Cleburne Transfer Station has free mulch, for a good, moisture-retaining topping for your plot. Come out on Fridays and Saturdays for a truck load or any time during operating hours if you want just a bucket full, or two.

“We were pleased by the interest and participation, pleased with the results it yielded and we look forward to other community involvement opportunities.”


Two submissions from Cleburne resident Ed Pruitt were chosen to serve as alternate logos. One depicts a spike fronted

by the letters CR, the other an on-coming locomotive.

“Ed’s entry is a symbolic tribute to the original Railroaders and a tradition established in Cleburne via the Santa Fe Railroad,” Cain said. “Ed captured the theme of The Depot, Railroaders baseball and western flair with his creative font selection and inclusion of a steam engine and railroad spike.”

The Railroaders will display all three logos on team gear, merchandise and marketing material, Fenyes said.

Work on the stadium, known as The Depot, is underway and set for completion later this year. The Railroaders are set to begin play next year. ■
