

Meet City Council

The Cleburne City Council consists of four single-member district seats and a mayor.

In the single-member district system, each area elects its own representative. The mayor, however, is elected by all residents eligible to vote.

Cleburne has a council-manager system of government. Under this system, an elected council makes policy and passes ordinances, and the city manager supervises city opera-

tions and implements policies adopted by the council.

Council members serve two-year terms. The council meets at 5 p.m. the second and fourth Tuesday of each month at Cleburne City Hall, 10 N. Robinson St. The city hall building anchoring the east end of downtown, formerly housed a post office. The public is encouraged to attend council meetings. Mums: A Texas Tradition!!

Take a trip down Cleburne's Homecoming memory lane!!

The Layland Museum of History is proud to announce a special exhibit, *Mum's the Word: Homecoming Mums, a Texas Tradition*. Admission is free, and the exhibit is open through December 31 during regular museum hours: Monday through Friday 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., and Saturday 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. The exhibit is sponsored by Flybox Wifi and Southwestern Adventist University.

Native Texans are often surprised to learn that residents of other states have never heard of Homecoming Mums. The folk art tradition is unique to Texas and is one of the many ways Texans show their devotion to high school football. In the Layland exhibit, photographs, newspapers, actual Homecoming Mums, and other spirit items trace the 75-year history of Homecoming Mums, particularly at Cleburne High School.

Guest curator of the exhibit is Chloe Northrop,

an Associate Professor of History at Tarrant County College. She received a Ph.D. from the University of North Texas in History with a minor in Art History. Northrop is also a continuing visiting lecturer at Southwestern Adventist University.

Visitors of all ages are invited to weave ribbons into bookmark-length "spirit streamers" in Cleburne High School's black and gold. Group tours for groups of 8 or more are free of charge but must be scheduled at least two weeks in advance at 817-645-0940 or museum@cleburne.net.

Located in the 1905 former Carnegie Library of Cleburne, Texas, the Layland Museum focuses on local history and regional home life. For more information, call the Layland Museum at 817-645-0940.

ATMOS IS UP TO SOME THING!!

Atmos Energy contract crews will provide a temporary repair to paved areas with a permanent repair following.

Questions regarding the Atmos Energy pipeline project.

What work is being done?

Contract crews for Atmos Energy will replace distribution pipeline from the customer meter to the street.

Why is this work being done?

Atmos Energy’s top priority is to provide safe and reliable natural gas service for the communities we serve and to accomplish that, we are upgrading our natural gas infrastructure.

When will the work be done?

Contract crews will begin work around October 3, 2016. Normal working hours will be 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., weather permitting. The project is scheduled to be complete by the end of December 2016.

Where will the work be done?

Work will occur in an area bounded by Glenwood Drive on the North, Wedgewood Drive to the West, Hilltop Drive to the South and S Ridgeway Drive to the East.

Who is doing the work?

Texas State Utilities will be doing the work on behalf of Atmos Energy.

How will customers be notified?

At least three days prior to work being done, customers will receive an informational door tag. In addition, yard signs will be placed at the end of each block in which crews will be working.

How many crews will be working?

Atmos Energy will have 3 contract crews working in the area.

Will service be disrupted?

Every effort will be made to avoid service interruption. However, if service needs to be restored and a customer is not home, a door tag with a 24/7 phone number will be left for the customer to call to have their service restored.

What are the flags and spray paint marks in my yard and in the street?

Flags and spray paint marks show the location of underground utilities. It is extremely important to know where underground utility lines are located and as required by law, Atmos Energy contract crews will obtain line locates prior to commencing work. Homeowners should always call 811 at least three days before digging to have underground utilities located. It's easy, free and it's the law.

How will paving be repaired?

Atmos Energy contract crews will provide a temporary repair to paved areas with a permanent repair following.

Will my yard or trees be disturbed during this work?

Crews will make every effort to avoid disturbing yards and trees, however, if they are disturbed, crews will provide repairs. ■






