## Meet City Council

The Cleburne City Council consists of four single-member district seats and a mayor.

In the single-member district system, each area elects its own representative. The mayor, however, is elected by all residents eligible to vote.

Cleburne has a council-manager system of government. Under this system, an elected council makes policy and passes ordinances, and the city manager supervises city opera-

tions and implements policies adopted by the council.

Council members serve two-year terms. The council meets at 5 p.m. the second and fourth Tuesday of each month at Cleburne City Hall, 10 N. Robinson St. The city hall building anchoring the east end of downtown, formerly housed a post office. The public is encouraged to attend council meetings. # WHAT TO DO WITH THAT HOLIDAY TRASH?

Besides all the wrapping paper and boxes that fill a room as presents are opened, there's the leftovers that you really don't want to eat.

Pile snow not trash this holiday season!!!

**W**ell, the holidays are here and along with all the festivities comes clean-up. Besides all the wrapping paper and boxes that fill a room as presents are opened, there's the leftovers that you really don't want to eat. Then there's the big things that need to be tossed out, like that 40 year old TV that you finally replaced. Oh, and when you were getting the Christmas decorations out, you found the silver-foil Christ-

mas tree from 1964 that still has the light and the colored lens plate that turns, changing the color of the tree. And honestly, that thing need to go!

So what do you do with all that trash? The cart will hold the regular trash and the extra food trash, but there's not more room for the paper, cardboard, Christmas tree, and the stuff that pre-dates the Jimmy Carter presidency. So here are some great ideas to help you get rid of it.

## FEATURE

**Recycle**—The Cleburne Transfer Station takes cardboard, metal, glass, #1 and #2 plastics, paper, cooking oil and motor oil. These things can be dropped off at no charge. Also, there are three Remote Recycling areas in Cleburne that will take #1 and #2 plastics, cardboard, and metal. They are:

**North side**—on Rose Street at the back of Fire Station 3 (the Kilpatrick Station) at elevated water tank

**South side**—at the Whistle Stop building at the back side of Hulen Park, at the corner of S. Walnut St and Country Club Rd.

**East side**—in Carver Park parking lot, down Park St off Mansfield Hwy

### The Do's and Don'ts for Recycle

#### Do

- Separate the bulk into like items. Each product has its own bin.
- Make sure the items inside the

bin and aren't just thrown on the ground.

- Break down cardboard boxes to where they are flat before putting them into the bin.

#### Don't

- Don't put items that have food residue on them in recycle bins.
- Don't leave wrapping paper connected with or inside cardboard
- Don't put foiled paper, or the like, in with paper products

**Christmas Trees**—can be brought to the Cleburne Transfer Station during business hours at no charge. Also, City trucks will pick up Christmas trees at residences on December 30<sup>th</sup> and January 6<sup>th</sup>.

**FEATURE**

**Bulk pick up**—for items that are TOO LARGE FOR THE TRASH CONTAINER. Bulk pick up takes a week to complete in each area, so make sure you have your items by the curb by 7am the MONDAY of your bulk week. To know when your bulk week is, refer to the following guide:

<u>If your normal pick-up day is</u>	<u>bulk week for that area begins</u>
Monday	the 1 <sup>st</sup> Monday of the month
Tuesday	the 2 <sup>nd</sup> Monday of the month
Wednesday	the 3 <sup>rd</sup> Monday of the month
Thursday	the 4 <sup>th</sup> Monday of the month

**The Do's and Don'ts for Bulk Pick-up**

**Do**

- Have your items at the curb by 7 am Monday of your bulk week.
- Make sure piles of tree limbs are separate from bulk items.
- Make sure all piles (limbs and bulk) are at least 3 feet from obstacles (mailbox, fence, trash cart).
- Cut tree limbs into sections of 10 feet long or less.

**Don't**

- Don't put any piles over the City water meter
- Don't put any piles under low hanging tree limbs or low hanging power lines.
- Don't put items out before 5 pm on the Friday preceding your bulk week.
- Don't put out construction debris.
- Don't put out limbs cut by professional tree cutters.
- Don't put out eviction items.

**FEATURE**

- Don't put out items not taken at Transfer Station, like refrigerators, air conditioners, grass, paint, etc.

The Sanitation Department will have various closures during the season. The Sanitation Routes will have no changes since Christmas and New Year's Day are both on Sundays. The Cleburne Transfer Station Holidays will be as follows:

**Christmas Holiday**

December 24 (Christmas Eve)	Closed
December 26 (Day after Christmas)	Open 8 am to noon

**New Year's Holiday**

December 31 (New Year's Eve)	Closed
January 2, 2017	Open all day

Remember that an OUT OF CYCLE pick-up can be scheduled for a \$30 fee. OUT OF CYCLE pick-ups will be scheduled as requested and can be arranged at the City Services building (Water Utilities Department) at 420 W. Henderson or by calling 817-645-0919. The \$30 fee must be paid in advance, and items are usually picked up by the next business day. We want to do all we can help you make this holiday season the best it can be,

regardless of how you celebrate. And while you are on your own dealing with family, we are anxious to help you all through the year with your trash disposal needs. We offer service to the very best of our abilities, and with your help, we can even do more. Make sure you follow the instructions for recycle and bulk item disposal. # Christmas Tree Collections

*Need somewhere to take your Christmas tree after the holidays?*

**T**he City of Cleburne Sanitation Department will pick up Christmas trees that are placed at the curb on Friday, December 30 and Friday, January 6th. The trees must be placed at the curb for collection by 7:00 a.m. Trees must be free of all decorations, bags, and stands. No trees will be collected during normal routes.

Trees can also be taken to the Cleburne Solid Waste Transfer Station where they will be shredded for mulch. Mulch is available free to the public. The City will provide

loading on Friday and Saturday's only. Large loads must be tarped before leaving the site. Citizens will be responsible for loading all other days. You must provide your own container for hauling.

If you wish to bring your Christmas tree to the Solid Waste Transfer Station located at 2625 Pipeline, we will accept the Christmas trees at no charge for city residents with a current water bill. Transfer Station hours are Monday - Saturday 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If you have questions, please call Annette at 817-645-0942.


